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Legislative Wins In Congress For NABIP

The recently passed federal \$1.7 trillion omnibus package to avert a government shutdown, also contained two significant NABIP back healthcare provisions.

NABIP supported provisions regarding telehealth and long-term care.

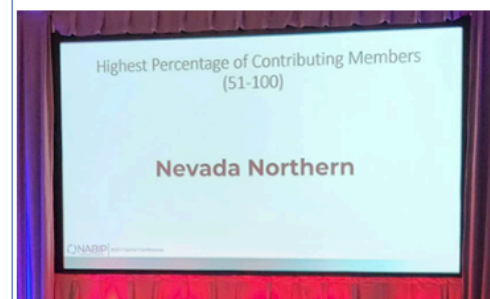
Individuals will now be able to use existing retirement accounts to pay for long-term insurance. More specifically, the provision will permit individuals to pay up to \$2,500 each year for long-term care insurance with their 401(k)s, 403(b)s and IRAs without a 10 percent early withdrawal penalty tax.

Also contained in the passed legislation was a two-year extension of telehealth-related regulatory flexibilities that were put in place during the pandemic.

In 2021, the CARES Act provided temporary relief during the pandemic by allowing HSA-qualified high-deductible health plans to cover telehealth services before reaching the deductible. It also allowed patients to choose and purchase telehealth services outside their HDHP without impacting their eligibility for an HSA.

Both provisions were strongly fought for by NABIP.
